

ORDINANCE NUMBER 383

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TIOGA ESTABLISHING THE SPEED LIMITS FOR TRAFFIC IN AND NEAR THE TIOGA HIGH SCHOOL DURING THE TIME THE SCHOOL IS IN SESSION AND DESIGNATING THE PORTION OF THE STREETS NEAR THE TIOGA HIGH SCHOOL THAT SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE REDUCED SPEED LIMIT WHILE SCHOOL IS IN SESSION; MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO EXCEED THE POSTED SPEED LIMIT IN A MOTOR VEHICLE; PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE.

WHEREAS, it is important to regulate the speed at which motor vehicles travel in the immediate vicinity of the Tioga High School; and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest to establish school speed zones and to reduce the speed of motor vehicles during times when children are present; and

WHEREAS, the regulation and reduction of the speed of motor vehicles around the high school will make the school a safer place;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TIOGA:

SECTION 1: The following street within the city limits of the City of Tioga is hereby designated to be a school zone:

- A. Mohawk Street from the intersection with Shawnee Street to a sign placed 695' south of Swaha Road.
- B. Shawnee Drive from a sign placed 225 east of the intersection with Hwy 377 to the intersection with Mohawk Road.

SECTION 2: In the area designated as a school zone, the maximum speed limit for a motor vehicle shall be thirty miles per hour (30 mph) except as otherwise provided in this ordinance.

SECTION 3: On any day of the year that the Tioga High School is in session, beginning at 7:30 a.m. and continuing until 8:30 a.m., then beginning at 2:00 p.m. and continuing until 4:00 p.m., the maximum speed limit for motor vehicles shall be twenty miles per hour (20 mph) in the designated school zone.

SECTION 4: Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not the exceed the amount specified in the Uniform Traffic Law of the State of Texas.


SECTION 5: This ordinance shall become effective after passage as made and provided by the law of the State of Texas.
